They also enjoyed watching them have so much fun. When ARK learned about CFCE and our motor challenged children, they immediately thought this would be an amazing program for our children to experience. And amazing it has been! ARK purchased all of the art supplies needed for the class and also brought in additional instructors and volunteers that assisted in the

classroom. CFCE and ARK are hoping with the success of this program to be awarded a larger grant amount for continuing the art program on a larger scale.

The first session of the CFCE/ARK pilot program was held on December 28th and 29th and the second session on February 19th and 20th. The pilot class was held during the same time as the regular Conductive Education (CE) art session in order not to interrupt the children's normal CE itinerary. This special art class ran for about an hour each day. All completed pieces will be displayed at a reception exhibit to be held at a Loveland art gallery or at the CFCE center. The art "masterpieces" on canvas are finished for immediate hanging at the reception and all the paper "masterpieces" will be matted and framed. Until the reception, the finished pieces are on display in the CFCE classroom. CFCE and ARK plan to run the pilot class one more session with CFCE's new conductor, Sevi.
