ki Days are fast-approaching and we urgently need your help to make them happen. Ski Days, made possible by our generous donors, are always a huge hit



We had a great, and very full, summer this year at CFCE. 27 children attended 6 camps over 11 weeks, the most camp kids we have ever had! 4 children, who were new to the program, began after-school year round classes after the end of camp. We had two new camps this year, a Transition Camp for teens and a High Ability camp for mildly impacted children. Both were well receieved and will be offered again next summer. Our camp days were extended by an hour this year, which allowed for 30 hours of intensive intervention every week!

Meet A CFCE Kid: Madeleine Written by her mother, Corinne

At first glance this picture might look like a naughty 4 year old is about to get scolded for counter surfing. But you'd be wrong. Instead, Maddie was praised for being able to figure out she needed to pull the dishwasher door down, to crawl on top and then stand up to reach the toaster on the counter which she desperately wanted to play with. You see, Madeleine has a rare neurological disorder called Pitt Hopkins Syndrome which impairs her motor planning, causes gross and fine motor challenges and is responsible for other global developmental delays. So when this curious little girl was motivated enough by the toaster to plan 3 or 4 steps ahead to reach her goal, her parents were ecstatic! Maddie was removed from danger and thrown into the air in celebration!

It is estimated that only 1,000 people around the world have been diagnosed with Pitt Hopkins Syndrome. This rare syndrome is usually caused by a de novo (noninherited) mutation of the TCF 4 gene on chromosome 18. People with this gene mutation have many challenges like Maddie, including difficulties learning to walk, challenges in controlling fine motor movements, lack of verbal language and delays in all developmental milestones.



Madeleine had the pleasure of starting Conductive Ed in July at the intense 3-week long, 5-day a week, 6-hour a day summer camp. During camp Maddie developed her strength, confidence and abilities in not only learning to walk, but all areas of her life. She started to feed herself, participate in her self-care routines such as dressing and undressing (she has become an expert at unzipping and escaping her sleep sack especially when protesting a nap), communicating with her family and friends by utilizing her talker AND taking up to 6 unassisted steps! To say the least, it was a big summer for Madeleine.

So much progress was made at summer camp that we did all we could to rearrange her packed therapy schedule to allow for weekly group CE classes and private at home sessions. After only 4 weeks of group classes, Maddie is now reliably taking up to 12 controlled, unassisted steps, often to reach something she's been longing to play with for years. We love how the independence Maddie is gaining through the help of CE is uncovering more and more of her personality, helping us better understand what motivates her. It turns out we have a very silly, brave and somewhat naughty little girl on our hands and we LOVE it! We can't wait to see what she gets into next.



Fall Family Festival: Fritzler Farm

We were excited to be given the opportunity by Fritzler Farm Park in LaSalle to host our first Fall Family Festival. The event was part fundraiser, part family fun activity! We sold baked goods, produce, Teal Pumpkins (as part of the Teal Pumpkin Project), flowers, and hot apple cider and enjoyed the many activities offered at the farm park: pumpkin picking, playing in the corn pit, sliding down the huge slides, riding on the train, visiting the farm animals, and more. One of the highlights was a wheelchair race on Fritzler's race track. CFCE received a portion of the proceeds for all tickets we sold as well as the 50% proceeds of all Teal Pumpkins that were sold for the rest of the season. Family Assistance Fund UPDATE:

For many of our children, conductive education has meant the difference between not walking and walking, being dressed each morning and dressing independently, feeling alone and having friends just like them. Financial capacity should never mean the difference between dependence and independence.

The out-of-pocket cost for sessions is one of the biggest barriers to families wanting to enter our program so we are very excited to currently have two families accessing our program, with the help of the Family Assistance Fund, and more interested.

We are incredibly grateful for the financial support from our generous donors who supported this program that has allowed us to extend funding to families who would otherwise not be able to attend our classes. We are looking forward to having more students using these funds to take part in CFCE's lifechanging intervention and community.



Adult Program

Conductive Education isn't just for kids! Around the world CE is used as an effective intervention for adults with motor disabilities such as cerebral palsy, stroke, Traumatic Brain Injury, Parkinson's disease, and multiple sclerosis. We are still working to create a weekly adult group at our Arvada location.



The program will run two times a week for 3 hours a day. This group will be comprised of adults 18 and older and aimed to increase independence and self-efficacy. We currently have 2 adults who are interested and we are looking for 2-3 more to launch the program in January 2019. New Summer Program: Teen Transition Camp

This summer, 4 teens signed up for our first ever transition camp. The camp was created after several long-time CFCE parents expressed interest in a camp that would meet the changing needs of their preteen/teenage children. This camp had a very different format to our typical summer camps, taking place 3 days a week and out in the community.

The purpose of the transition camp was to help the kids identify areas of their lives in which they could increase their independence, with the ultimate goal of living on their own someday. All of the kids set goals for themselves on the first day and we spent the remaining days working on the skills they wanted to improve.



One of the highlights of the week was one of the campers successfully transferring, without assistance, into a car from her wheelchair for the first time! The group enjoyed the program and all said they are excited to sign up again next year.



During the camp we went to a local gym, where the campers learned about the specific areas of their bodies they needed to strengthen in order to improve their independence and practiced using the equipment. We also made a trip to the grocery store where we practiced finding specific items. We returned to the center after this trip and the group made their own dinner; lasagna and a fruit salad dessert! A trip to Old Navy gave the group the opportunity to practice navigating a clothing store by themselves and staying within a budget. The last day was a fun scavenger hunt in Old Towne Arvada where we talked about accessibility difficulties they may encounter.
